"Cry Wolf" is a dance-theater production that interlaces the urgency of climate change awareness with the classic narrative of "The Boy Who Cried Wolf." The project transforms the familiar fable into a contemporary allegory about the dangers of ignoring repeated warnings, both environmental and ethical. Through a blend of highly physical choreography, text, and direct audience interaction, the show challenges spectators to discern truth from deception amidst a flood of information. Utilizing humor, "Cry Wolf" explores themes of responsibility, misinformation, and communal consequence, making it a poignant commentary on the state of our world's climate discourse and democratic engagement.

Since its founding in 2014, NVA & Guests, led by choreographer Nicole Van Arx, has been invited to perform at The Joyce Theatre, The Westside Theatre, Joe's Pub, The New Victory Theatre, The Ailey Citigroup Theatre, and more.

Elodie Dufroux was born in Loudun, France. Elodie has worked with choreographers such as Hamilton's Jon Rua, Luis Salgado, and Atlantic Records choreographer, Carlos Neto. Elodie recently performed as a featured dancer for the Telemundo Upfront at the Ziegfeld Theatre. She was also one of dancers at the 2019-2020 New Year's Eve performance with the band PHISH at Madison Square Garden. Elodie Dufroux is developing and directing the original show, UN-SPOKEN. Rooted in her own personal experiences, UN-SPOKEN aims to raise awareness and open up conversations around the often-silenced topic of bullying.



GENERAL THEATER POLICIES

RE-SELLING OF TICKETS

BMCC Tribeca PAC does not authorize the resale of tickets.

LATECOMERS

Late seating is at the discretion of the producer and theatre management. Patrons arriving late will be seated only at appropriate intervals during the performance.

SMOKING

In compliance with New York City Health regulations and CUNY's tobacco policy, smoking is prohibited on the campus of Borough of Manhattan Community College, including the theaters.

FIRE NOTICE

In the event of a fire alarm, calmly head to the nearest exit and follow the instructions of the theatre staff

FOOD & BEVERAGES

Bottled water purchased at the theater's concessions stand is permitted into the theater. No outside food or beverage is allowed in the theaters.
